In today's message I want to share one of the main ideas I will have shared with our leaders at the retreat. It's about BUILDING A CULTURE OF ENCOURAGEMENT in our church. It's what I call, "Becoming a church of 'come-alongside' Christians." It sounds pretty tame, but it's not. If we live this out, I promise you, wonderful things are going to continue to happen in and through River West Church. And that is Christ's good goal. It's our goal too!
